
Garrett's Gift Science Activity

"Necessity is the Mother of Invention"

Anyone can be an inventor. In the movie, *Garrett's Gift*, Garrett Morgan moves to the city. He learns that traffic and car accidents are a big problem in city. He invents the traffic light to help make the street safer and save lives. In this activity, you can try to invent something new like Garrett Morgan. These activities can be done on your own, with a group, or with the entire class. Follow the directions below:

- 1. Make a list of some of the problems you see in your town.
- 2. Choose one big problem that you feel strongly about
- 3. Read a book or use the computer to find out more information about the problem
- 4. Think about an invention that could solve the problem
- 5. Draw a picture of your invention
- 6. Write about how your invention works

After you have finished creating your invention, you might want to share it with the class, with your friends or with a parent or guardian. Inventors come in all different shapes and sizes and you just might come up with the next invention that could change the world.




Critical Thinking
